Overview:

Electronic medical record (EMR) adoption in healthcare is on the rise. Studies demonstrate that electronic medical records (EMRs) used in exam rooms can have a negative impact on patient-doctor communication. While there are known skills and behaviors that can enhance patient-centered use of the EMR, providers are often not taught these key communication skills. This session will help participants understand how EMR use affects the patient-doctor relationship, review best practices and teach participants the skills to use the EMR to enhance patient doctor communication.

Desired Learning Outcomes: At the completion of this learning activity, participants should be able to:

- Grasp the impact that the use of technology has on patient-doctor communication and identify best practices for patient-centered technology;
- Identify at least one (1) new EHR skill or behavior, as a tool, to enhance patient communication within the clinical setting.
