On June 28, 2012, the United States Supreme Court released its ruling in the National Federation of Independent Business, et al., v. Sebelius, Secretary of Health and Human Services, et al. finding the law to be constitutional. In the majority opinion, the constitutionality of the individual mandate section of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA) — the centerpiece of the case — was upheld under the rationale that the constitutional power to levy taxes sufficiently

extended to the law. Based on this landmark decision, physicians will be faced with and challenged by an extreme acceleration of changes with activity in the medical practice and a new set of patients flooding primary care offices requiring immediate care.

- Explain how they fit into the implementation of the Affordable Care Act from a legal point of view.
- Identify how the political process in the next several months may affect that implementation.
