ACLS also pertains to the expertise and coaching vital to making use of this life saving process properly and safely. To qualify for ACLS training you must be a medical professional such as a registered nurse or physician. Unlike BLS (Basic Life Support) which doesn't require complex and extensive education and training, ACLS education is mandatory for employment in hospitals, clinics, doctors' offices and other medical facilities.
