

## Presents: 2020 Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support (ACLS) Certification Course 7.0 CME Credits

**Overview:** ACLS is a protocol for managing victims suffering from severe cardiac conditions and other medical challenges. Through ACLS training health professionals may develop the expertise and skills needed to use this life-saving process properly and safely. To qualify for ACLS training you must be a medical professional such as a registered nurse or physician. Unlike BLS (Basic Life Support), which doesn't require complex and extensive education and training, ACLS certification is required for health care providers working in acute care settings and also by providers of emergency services. The majority of hospitals and emergency services require that this certification be accredited by the American Heart Association (AHA). **Note: There is a minimum requirement of** <u>10</u> and a maximum of <u>20</u> participants.
